

Are you in high school taking AACC college classes? The Early College Access Grant makes classes affordable!



Early College Access Grant (ECAG)

High School students who demonstrate financial need and meet eligibility requirements* may apply to receive \$200 per term to help pay for the costs of Anne Arundel Community College (AACC) courses.

Simply submit the <u>Early College Access Grant (ECAG) application</u> and complete the <u>FAFSA</u>. Grant money is limited and distributed on a first-come, first-served basis to qualified applicants, so apply **now**. Students who are approved for the ECAG for fall term and are taking AACC courses in the spring will receive \$200 each term.

Steps to Apply

Complete the following:

- 1. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- 2. Complete the 2020-2021 Early College Access Grant (ECAG) application.
- 3. Submit completed ECAG application to finaid@aacc.com or mail to AACC Financial Aid Office, 101 College Parkway, Arnold, MD 21012. FAX: 410-777-4019
- 4. Check your AACC student email at <u>MyAACC</u> regularly in order to confirm successful submission of FAFSA and ECAG application.
- 5. Notification of award eligibility will be sent to your AACC student email address.
