

## Prince George's County Public Schools Dual Enrollment

In keeping with our goals to insure that every child is college and career ready, Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) high school juniors and seniors have the opportunity to earn college credit, while still in high school through the Dual Enrollment Program.



#### What is dual enrollment?

 High school students who are also taking courses at a college or university

## **PGCPS** will pay for:

- Tuition for ALL students dually enrolled in qualified courses at any Maryland public college or university
- Fees and textbooks ONLY for students who receive free and reduced meals (FARMS).
  - Fees range from \$120-\$300 depending on the school selected
- Fall, Spring, and Summer sessions

### What is the Accuplacer exam?

- Accuplacer is a college placement exam that is accepted for admissions to some colleges and universities.
- PGCPS will be paying for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders, who meet minimum qualifications and are interested in dual enrollment for Spring 2015, to take the exam one time. The testing window is September 15 October 1. Please contact your school for the specific date.
- Students who have previously taken the exam, and are satisfied with their scores, are not required to retake it.

## PGCPS students must meet the following criteria:

- Minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA
- Enrolled in 11th or 12th grade
- Meet college requirements on college admissions tests – SAT, ACT, Accuplacer
- Provide own transportation to and from the college campus
- Minimum admissions requirements may vary at each college

### How do I apply?

- Take college placement exam Accuplacer, SAT, ACT
- Meet with guidance counselor to identify course(s) and documentation needed
- Complete application packet
- ➤ Each institution may have a different admissions process. Please contact them directly for additional details.

## What is the timeline for submitting applications for Summer and Fall 2015 enrollment?

- Prince George's Community College May 7 (Summer and Fall)
- University of Maryland May 1 (Summer), August 1 (Fall)
- Bowie State University contact school
- Anne Arundel Community College contact school
- College of Southern Maryland May 15 (Summer), August 1 (Fall)



# Prince George's County Public Schools Dual Enrollment By The Numbers

PGCPS has provided tuition support for all 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders who are dually enrolled in a qualifying state college or university beginning in 2013. This program has resulted in increased college credits earned for participating students.
