## Senior Year Checklist

## Summer Before 12<sup>th</sup> grade

	<b>Set up your FSA ID.</b> You should set up your username and password (FSA ID) before you fill out the FAFSA in October of your senior year. Get a head-start by setting this up in the summer at: https://fafsa.ed.gov/
	Refine your college list. Narrow down your list to a maximum of 10 colleges.
	Visit the schools you have on your college list. If you can't visit a school, do virtual tours on YouTube and research the school on Naviance.
	Go to college fairs. Speak with admissions professionals.
	Draft your <b>resume</b> . Make sure you begin making a resume of your awards and achievements, activities, and work/volunteer experiences so far. Many colleges request this as part of their application. You can create a resume on Naviance.
	Set up your <b>Application Accounts</b> . Wouldn't it be easier to do ONE application for many schools rather than individual applications on many different websites? Set up accounts on <b>CommonApp</b> , <b>Common Black App</b> , and <b>Coalition</b> . Look into these three websites and see which ones have the majority of your colleges and apply that way. It's <u>WAY</u> easier. This also means writing ONE essay for many schools instead of ten.
· · · _ · _ · · · · · · · · · ·	<b>Draft Your Essays</b> : Write first drafts of all of the essays required for the schools you are applying to (including the CommonApp essay). Once you have your drafts, it is a good idea to reach out to a teacher (or teachers) to get feedback on the flow and content of your writing.

	<b>Take Dual Enrollment courses.</b> This is your last chance to take a course that will go onto your High School Transcript.
	Recommendation Requests: As soon as you get back to school, go back to your teachers and ask them again to be your recommendation writers. If they say YES, add them to Naviance as a recommender for ALL schools.
	Narrow your college list to 5-10 colleges. Add these colleges to your Naviance account by the 3 <sup>rd</sup> Friday of 12 <sup>th</sup> grade.
