# GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS - Coursework

## Minimum of 21 credits including the following:

- English: 4 credits
- Mathematics: 3 credits, 4 Years of High School Math (Algebra 1 → Geometry → 1 other math credit → 1 other math credit)
- Social Studies: 3 credits (US History, Government, and World History)
- Science: 3 credits (Biology → Biogeochemical Systems/Honors Chem → 3rd science)
- Fine Arts: 1 credit
- Technology Credit: (FOT or Intro to InfoTech DE for ITEC): 1 credit
- Personal Fitness: ½ credit
- Health: ½ credit
- 2 years of a foreign language
  - If you took Spanish 1 in MS, you will take Spanish 2 in 9th grade
  - If you did not take Spanish 1 in MS, you will take Spanish 1 in 9th grade
- Electives: Minimum 3.0 credits

# Student Service Learning

- Service-learning is a teaching method that combines meaningful service to the community with curriculum-based learning
- Students improve their academic skills by applying what they learn in school to the real world; they then reflect on their experience to reinforce the link between their service and their learning.

# Student Service Learning

- Prince George's County Public Schools students must engage in a minimum of **75 student service-learning (SSL) hours** in order to successfully meet the service-learning graduation requirement. To ensure that students are able to meet this requirement, service-learning has been infused into the science and social studies curricula for grades 5-10 for a total of 51 hours. Social Studies courses provide a total of 28 curriculum-infused hours and Science courses provide a total of 23 curriculum-infused hours.
- **Additionally, students must complete 24 independent hours of service learning in order to meet the full 75 required hours.**

# Student Service Learning

- On the PGCPS site, there are some pre-approved organizations and sites. If your student would like to volunteer with an organization **not** listed on the PGCPS site, a Pre-Approval Site form must be completed and submitted to Ms. Amos or Mr. Pitter **prior** to completing the volunteer opportunity.
- In order for SSL hours to count, a Student Service Learning Verification Form must be fully completed and submitted to Ms. Amos or Mr. Pitter by...
  - **October 15** for independent hours earned between July 1 and August 30
  - **January 31** for independent hours earned between September 1 and January 31
  - **July 15** for independent hours earned between February 1 and June 30
- All SSL forms can be found on the PGCPS site as well as at Ms. Amos/Mr. Pitter's office. Forms must be submitted as hard copies. They can be given directly to Ms. Amos/Mr. Pitter.

- Earn high school diploma + AA in Information Technology
- Entry permitted only for incoming 9th graders

# ITEC PROGRAM

(INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY EARLY COLLEGE)

- Enrollment Process Begins in Spring
- Minimum Requirements:
  - Accuplacer Reading Comprehension Score of 79
  - Interest in IT
  - Willingness to sacrifice
- No more than 24 students per cohort
- Years 1 & 2 @ CMIT-South; Years 3 & 4 @ PGCC



## DUAL ENROLLMENT

Prince George's Community College, University of Maryland, Bowie State University, Anne Arundel Community College, College of Southern Maryland

### Requirements:

- Must be enrolled in the 11th or 12th grade
- 2.5 cumulative GPA or higher
- Meet college requirement on the Accuplacer/SAT/ACT
- Provide transportation to and from the college campus
- Minimum admissions requirements vary by college
