### Before Leaving Home



- Parents are asked to please do a
   symptoms check before scholars leave
   home. This can include taking your
   temperature and taking note of any signs
   of sickness, such as a sore throat or
   sneezing.
- If you have signs of sickness, it's important that they stay home.

• If you have a fever <u>you must</u> stay at home!

## **Before Leaving Home**



If you have symptoms, you should remain in distance learning until symptoms have disappeared and it is safe to return to hybrid learning. You will be marked present for distance learning.

### What to Wear?

Please make sure you scholar is dressed appropriately!

Uniforms are not mandatory during hybrid learning!

## The Casual Dress Code includes but is not limited to:

- NO workout / bike / volleyball style spandex shorts
- NO ripped or ripped and repaired jeans, pants or skirts
- NO ripped or repaired jackets, shirts or tops
- NO cropped shirts or tops
- NO inappropriate graphic t-shirts
  Solid colored mask only
  (no writing or designs)

### What to Bring?

- Children who are unable to wear a face mask due to medical condition must have a physician's statement (if students are physically unable to wear a mask)

## No Student should arrive before 8:15. **No Supervision**

## First Period begins at 8:45 daily (virtual and Hybrid)

#### No Parents will be permitted in the building. Safety First

- Once students arrive, <u>masks required!</u>
- Students must enter wearing face masks
- Students must enter 6ft apart.
- MS Students will enter and exit at the ramp.
- HS enter and exit at the entrance past the MS.

- Breakfast will be available to pick up as you enter the building.
- Breakfast will be eaten in your 1st period classroom.
- All meals are free.
- Please do not share food with other students.

- Report immediately to your class when you enter the building.
- Lockers will not be issued during Hybrid Learning.
- You will keep all of your personal belongings with you at all times. You may not store any items in a teacher's classroom.

# What Will Instruction Look Like?



- 12-15 students in a class approximately 6 feet apart when feasible, and facing the same direction.
- Assigned seats with minimal movement
- <u>Virtual learning</u> via their issued or personal device.
- Teachers will teach virtually from their classroom and remain socially distant from students.

# Special Education Services

Ms. Monroe & Ms. Ojuolape

- Students will still receive Special Education services virtually.
- Virtual breakout rooms and the Resource room is available (please bring your headphones).
- Students that require testing, appointments will be given by a special educator or the school psychologist.
  - Students remaining in distance learning will still be allowed to come into the building for testing.
- Educational Assessments will be completed in person.

- All students must remain seated in their assigned seat.




# Dismissal



### Dismissal

- Dismissal window is 2:50 3:00 pm.
  - We promptly dismiss all remaining students 3:00 pm.
- Parents will use the PikMyKid app to alert teachers that they have arrived in order for everyone to have a safe school dismissal during hybrid learning.
- Once a student is called through the app, The student will leave the classroom and will immediately go to the pick up area.
- Teachers will track students through a batching system and will present it to the class during dismissal time.

## Removal from Hybrid Instruction

SOME REASONS STUDENTS MIGHT NEED TO RESUME DISTANCE LEARNING!

- If a student cannot adhere to the safety protocols and guidelines
- If a student refuses to wear a mask or wear mask correctly for the entirety of the school day.
- If a student consistently exhibits discipline concerns/ misbehavior
- If a student exhibits Inconsistent attendance
- If a student has a positive case, or has been exposed to someone with Covid-19
- If a student is not cleared by the nurse for PGCPS required immunizations

#### **CARES ROOM**

If my student, staff member or someone else gets sick.

Student/Staff member is removed from class;

- Maryland Department of Health recommends all schools have an area to isolate sick children from well children
- CMIT Academy South MHS will use the nurses suite
- If student exhibit symptoms, student will be removed and placed in the **isolation area of the nurse's suite**.
- We are aware that other illnesses can present covid like symptoms (i.e. asthma). In the event symptoms occur the nurse will evaluate the student and parent will be called for pickup.
- Parents have 1 hour to pick up child from school.

Student/Staff member who get sick in class with one of 3 B's (burns, bleeding, bodily fluid)

- Classroom closed, staff and students relocated, sick child taken to the CARES room in Nurse's Suite.
- CARE Room (Covid Assessment Exam Room)
