- Applicant must have achieved at least two (2) of the following: (a) minimum of B+ average
 (b) ranked in the top 25% of class, (c) ACT score of 24 or SAT score of 1100 (Math and Reading)
- 3. Applicant must have participated in two (2) sports for a least two (2) years in each sport
- 4. Applicant must have earned at least one (1) varsity letter in each of the two (2) sports
- 5. Applicant must complete enclosed scholar/essay application
- 6. Applicant must have a letter of recommendation from the high school athletic administrator/director
- 7. School athletic director must be an NIAAA member and a member of their respective state athletic administrators/directors association (*MSADA*)
- 8. The principal or athletic director must sign the application to insure that the academic information submitted is accurate
