- 2. A 750-1000 word essay from the applicant addressing two questions: 1. How has your adversity or hardship impacted your ability to pursue college or your career goals and how would this scholarship help you overcome your adversity or hardship. 2. How your collegiate study* might prepare you for a career supporting intelligence, homeland security, or national defense objectives (*Acceptable fields of study include systems engineering; software engineering; math; cyber; information technology; electrical engineering; computer engineering; computer science; physics; mechanical engineering; materials science; or engineering relating to IT, communications, or electronics.) (submit with on-line application).
- 3. A **resume** from the applicant detailing, at a minimum, the applicant's accomplishments, work experience, and community involvement (submit this as an attachment to the on-line application).
- 4. An official, certified high school transcript of completed courses and grades mailed directly from the high school to the address above or emailed directly from the high school to scholarships@centralmd.afceachapters.org.
- 5. Test scores: A copy of the applicant's SAT or ACT scores from the testing center. Email the report that you receive from the testing center to scholarships@centralmd.afceachapters.org. AFCEA is not listed as a site that scores be sent to. Be sure that the report has your full name on it. Note: if you do not have SAT or ACT scores and have PSAT scores or equivalent, please provide those scores. If you have AP test scores, please provide those scores. While there is no requirement for test scores this year due to coronavirus challenges, the Evaluation Committee will take test scores into consideration if they are provided.
- 6. Two letters of recommendation: one letter must be from an academic person (i.e., a school official teacher, principal) and one letter must be from a non-academic person (i.e., a person outside of school clergy, a person you work/intern for, a volunteer leader, a coach). Letters from school counselors are not acceptable. Letters should be specific to this scholarship and not be letters that are for entry to a university or college. Letters may be emailed to scholarships@centralmd.afceachapters.org. Please follow up with the persons who are emailing letters of recommendation to ensure that they have submitted them.

You will be asked to certify that all the information provided in the application is true to the best of your knowledge before submitting the application.
