GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- English: 4 credits
- Mathematics: 3 credits, 4 Years of High School Math (Algebra 1 → Geometry → Algebra 2 → fourth course and more)
- Social Studies: 3 credits (US History, Government, and World History)
- Science: 3 credits (Biology → Biogeochemical or Chemistry Honors → Environmental Science or Physics or AP Science)
- Fine Arts: 1 credit (Drama, Piano, Art 1, or Music Survey)
- Technology Credit: 1 Credit (FOT or INT1010 for ITEC)
- Personal Fitness: ½ credit
- Health: ½ credit

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS continued...

- 2 years of the <u>SAME</u> foreign language
- A minimum of 4 credits earned in your senior year
 - At CMIT, juniors and seniors are given full 8-credit schedules and can drop courses based only on their job/internship and Dual Enrollment schedules
- A total of 21 credits are required for Graduation.
- A total of 24 service hours are also required.



PROMOTIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Grade 9 to Grade 10

- Must have 5 credits by end of year
 - Must include 1 English

Grade 10 to Grade 11

- Must have 10 credits by end of year
 - Must include: 2 English, 1 Mathematics, 1 Science, and 1 Social Studies

Grade 11 to Grade 12

- Must have 14 credits by end of year
 - Must include: 3 English, 2 Mathematics, 1 Science, 1 Social Studies
 - AND be able to fulfill all graduation requirements within a full Senior Year Schedule

SERVICE LEARNING

- You <u>MUST</u> complete **24 Student Service Learning** Hours in order to graduate.
- All SSL must be done with nonprofit and/or tax exempt organizations - you cannot get service hours for paid work or for volunteer work done at a for-profit business
- All hours have to be completed outside of your scheduled school hours

SchoolMax

- Family Access Portal allows you and your parents to log-in from any computer with an Internet connection and view student information
 - Students can view assignment scores as teachers post them each week Students can also see their attendance records
- If you are ever having issues with a SchoolMax account that was working previously, go to to IDM.PGCPS.ORG to reset your password.
- Parents can also create their own account by registering through the PGCPS website under the PARENT tab
- Important: Now that you are in high school, it is YOUR responsibility to know what your grades are - it is not just on your parents to know how you are doing

SCHOOL COUNSELING DEPARTMENT FUNCTIONS

- Counseling students in academic, college and career readiness, personal and socioemotional
- Keeper of your transcripts transcript requests go through Ms. Gaudette
- Scheduling/Withdrawal of Students for their classes and making sure that students meet their graduation requirements
- Schedule Parent Teacher Conferences with all stakeholders (parents, students, admin, teachers, etc.)
- Ensuring that college application materials are ready to go! (and writing ALL seniors a recommendation letter)

SCHOOL COUNSELING DEPARTMENT FUNCTIONS (continued)

- Annual review of records (credit evaluations)
- Completion of 4-year plans with students
- Classroom activities (orientations and other lessons)
- Special programs (College Knowledge Retreats, College Trips, Information Sessions, etc.)

TIPS FOR CLASSROOM SUCCESS

- Get to know your teachers...they're people too
- Be interested in learning or at least find something interesting in what you learn
- Take good notes and study for tests and quizzes
- Turn your assignments in on time CMIT has a no late work policy
- Ask questions when you do not understand something
- Check School Max regularly

WHAT TO DO IF YOU NEED HELP

- Evaluate your own performance and identify your strengths and weaknesses
- Seek assistance from your teacher and schedule more study time
- Get a study partner that excels in the class
- Be responsible for your own success
- Consider getting a tutor
- Meet with your School Counselor

- Four Year Colleges and Universities (i.e. Loyola College Maryland, University of Maryland, College Park)
- Military Academies (i.e. Air Force Academy)
- Trade Schools (IIT Tech, Cosmetology School)

PREPARING FOR COLLEGE

- When is the best time to begin preparing for college?
- What are colleges looking for? What do they see?
 - Good grades in challenging courses
 - Student involvement in activities/work
 - Teacher/Counselor recommendations
 - SAT/ACT scores

- What type of career are you looking for? What are you interested in? What are you good at?
 - Do activities related to your career field of interest
 - Take career assessments!

COLLEGE PREPARATION

- Select advanced level courses that will prepare you for college (i.e. Honors, AP and Dual Enrollment)
- Go online and check admission requirements for colleges you are interested in (online application, application fees, essays, recommendations, testing and transcript requirements)
- Become involved in school and community extracurricular activities - less is more if you have leadership experiences
- Visit Ms. Gaudette and read the CMIT Newsletter
- Explore volunteer and summer opportunities
